Year 7 North Pine Dam Excursion

On Wednesday the 4th of November, the Year 7 students visited North Pine Dam for SOSE. All the students had fun as they saw the dam.

We walked across the wall and saw the huge crane used for lifting the walls to let water through. We also had a closer look at the remote science lab used for testing the PH, salinity, dissolved oxygen, nitrates and temperature of the water. The wall had a speaker system that plays noises of eagles to scare birds from nesting.

Past the wall, we got to go fishing using nets. Many interesting waterborne creatures were found, from tadpoles to spiders and even eggs. At that time we also tested PH, dissolved oxygen and nitrates using water-soluble pills that make the water go to easily identifiable colours. We tested temperature with a thermometer and turbidity with a giant test tube with a pattern at the base. After lunch we continued on to the water treatment plant. Outside the plant, there were 2 giant swimming pool sized settling tanks and the bottoms were being scraped to get rid of leftover sludge. On the inside of the plant there were two







operational filtering tanks (a third was under construction). The water is filtered by sand and charcoal, which sometimes gets very dirty and has to be backwashed by air pushing backwards.

On that day we learnt where our water comes from, how water is prepared, precautions taken to keep the water clean, the speed at which water travels and that there is pretty cool marine life in the dam.


3D Printer

At the beginning of term 3, the IT&D department acquired a new 3D Printer.

The delight of such a new gadget opens many opportunities for both the Graphics and the Tech classes. As the new curriculum unfolds, design has been a much bigger focus that the previous curriculum.

It is fascinating to watch the 3D printer operate. Molten ABS (type of plastic) is layered at 0.25mm at a time. Some intricate objects will literally take 4-5 hours to produce. One doesn't need to be in a hurry!

This new printer, situated in D6 will be an outstanding resource for years to come.




