

All subjects on offer are available from Prep - Year 10 and are from the Australian Curriculum. Year 11 - 12 is the Old State Curriculum. Our year-group teaching teams take pride in bringing the curriculum to life through creative and engaging methods.

Our students are the central focus of all that we do at the College. While education is at the core of what we do, we understand education encompasses more than academics. We address your child's need to learn about themselves, build relationships in their community and investigate their place in this world. AGILE DIGITAL LEARNING

Through the use of information and communication technology (ICT) tools and innovative teaching, we ensure students engage in purposeful learning, equipping them with the knowledge, attributes and abilities to become global citizens of character who are responsive to the demands of an ICT-rich future.

All students have access to digital technology with Prep to Year 2 students having access to College iPads and laptops in the classrooms as required. Under our Agile Digital Learning Strategy, Year 3-6 students are required to bring their personal iPad to school each day, whilst Year 7-12 students are required to bring their personal laptops to school each day.

ROBOTICS AND CODING PROGRAM

Our robotics kits and coding programs help develop students' enquiry skills and an understanding for technological concepts; supporting essential life skills such as teamwork, time management, problem solving and communication. Students start their coding journey in Prep using Beebots, then start using other coding tools like Makey Makey, Scratch and Lego robots in their later primary years.

In addition to our strong digital literacy focus we provide a range of programs and extension activities for those students who have keen interest areas and wish to be academically challenged.

KINDERGARTEN at Prince of Peace

The Prince of Peace Kindergarten is located on our Junior Campus and provides a wonderful Early Learning environment for pre-Prep children.

SURROUNDED by grace

Home to our College's youngest members, our kindergarten program is designed to stimulate young minds to think independently and promote their own learning. It fosters creativity, challenges thought processes and supports cooperative learning. The program addresses the needs, interests and abilities of each child, recognising that each child is unique.

Our Kindergarten is led and staffed by very experienced Early Learning Teachers who have a passion for early childhood and work closely with parents to monitor and communicate each child's progress and development.

Working within the National Early Years Framework and the Queensland Kindergarten Learning Guidelines the Kindergarten operates an inclusive play-based program. With dedicated indoor and outdoor zones, students benefit from a range of focused early learning programs and activities that includes:

- Daily nature play
- Foundational literacy and numeracy
- Social & emotional learning
- Incursions with guest visitors
- Participation in Book Week
- Transition to Prep program
- Borrowing from the Junior Library regularly

The service operates a long-day program between 6.30am and 6:00pm, 50 weeks of the year, with children attending two to five days a week. CCS funding is available to eligible families.



Enrolment at the Prince of Peace Lutheran Kindergarten is separate from enrolment at the College.

JUNIOR SCHOOL at Prince of Peace

UNLEASH potential

Junior School is Prep to Year 6 and provides the foundations for students to transition successfully to Middle School. At Prince of Peace we want our youngest students to develop character, to develop a growth mindset and to commence acts of service.

PREP AT PRINCE OF PEACE

The separate Prep precinct located on the Junior Campus houses 3 Prep classrooms with their own secure playground. During the first year of learning, foundations are laid for the development of literacy and numeracy skills, with children supported to develop these skills at a rate appropriate for each child. Learning becomes more structured as the year progresses, ensuring a smooth transition into Year 1. As the Prep year progresses, the College maps out a plan for Prep students to integrate into the main campus community, as students grow in their excitement for the extra activities that are on offer during break times.

JUNIOR SCHOOL CURRICULUM

The Prep to Year 6 program provides a holistic educational journey for students aged 4 to 12, emphasising interactive and engaging methodologies. Rooted in the Australian Curriculum, it focuses on academic, social and emotional development, promoting critical thinking, creativity and collaboration. Our diverse teaching strategies cater to different learning styles, connecting learning to the real world. In a supportive environment, the program aims to foster curiosity, a lifelong love for learning, and equip students with essential skills for academic success and beyond.

EDUCATION SUPPORT

We are committed to helping each child reach their goals by catering for students' differing learning styles and academic needs. At Prince of Peace, we offer intervention for students experiencing short-term problems with literacy and numeracy learning, and long-term support and program options for students with identified learning difficulties and/or disabilities. Enrichment staff are allocated to classrooms at various points during the week to assist teachers in the delivery of the educational program. Additionally, the College has arrangements with a variety of Allied Health professionals, including Speech Pathologists, Occupational Therapy, Prep Screening and Psychologists from Therapy House who work at the College on a fee-for-service basis.

Nothing is left to chance, and during the Prep year, the College arranges for Allied Health Professionals to assist in ageappropriate screening for hearing, sight, speech and occupational therapy needs.

MIDDLE SCHOOL at Prince of Peace

Prince of Peace offers a distinct Middle School program for students in Years 7 to 9 as we recognise this important phase of growth and development for adolescents is a unique and transformative time in their life.

Years 7 and 8 – Discovering passions, strengths and capabilities as an emerging young adult.

Year 9 Ubuntu program – a rite of passage program allowing our students to step into their future selves.

With all students able to participate:

Therefore, we offer a deliberately different curriculum in Middle School to help students transition from Junior School and adjust to new routines and opportunities. This carefully crafted program limits the number of teachers the students interact with whilst they learn to navigate the secondary school structure. By Year 9 students are encompassed in a year-long program called Ubuntu (African for humanity to others) which provides them with rich and rewarding experiences to prepare them for their senior years of schooling (Years 10-12).

Our purpose-designed Middle School program inspires our young people to discover their passions and strengths, creating a pathway of possibilities in the senior years. Delivered in a supportive and stimulating environment, it supports our students as they move through the challenging adolescent years, and engages them in learning, promotes acceptance and belonging, and encourages personal development.

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW:

In Years 7 and 8 students sample a wide variety of subjects and learning experiences (on rotation per term/semester or year) to gain a feel for their interests and passions and help them determine future subject choices in Senior School. By Year 9 they choose four electives to complement Maths English, Science, History, PE, and Christian Studies. Students who excel are also offered extension opportunities and our Learning Support team are on hand to assist students with learning challenges.

UBUNTU our key to descent adolescent transformation

UBUNTU

One of the highlights of Middle School is the year long Ubuntu program. The Ubuntu program is unique to Prince of Peace and guides students through a year of social, emotional and spiritual growth. Combining our Physical Education and Christian Studies subjects, it offers a range of challenging activities and miniprograms to challenge our students physically, mentally and spiritually, and build their connections to each other, the College, their families and the wider community.

SERVICE LEARNING

Pastoral Care is our top priority. Pastoral care teachers, Year level coordinators, the Campus Leadership Team, the College Chaplain and the College Counsellor all form the Pastoral Care and Wellbeing Team on the Middle & Senior Campus.

The adolescence years and demands of senior schooling create a range of challenges for students of this age, and our team is on hand to guide and support students (and their parents) through difficult times. Students are encouraged to develop and grow as individuals and are provided opportunities to undertake challenges and courageous risks, always with a safety net provided.

UNLOCK future pathways

Senior School (Years 10-12) at Prince of Peace offers students the chance to personalise their Year 11 and 12 study program to reflect their career aspirations. Through the College's MyPoP Pathway program, students can individualise their program by choosing to study subjects or courses either on campus or off campus, through the College or via external providers.

There are numerous cultural programs in performing arts and music and sporting programs. Experienced Senior School teachers are on hand to mentor senior Students.

- 2. A guaranteed pathway plan with careers planning, support and guidance and

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

We pride ourselves on providing a flexible curriculum that offers our senior students as many course options as possible in a small class environment with committed and caring teaching staff. For further information on the curriculum, refer to the MyPoP Pathway Program on page 18.

PREPARATION FOR TERTIARY ADMISSION

Students wishing to undertake university study can choose to study a combination of general and applied subjects, along with diploma or certificate courses. The Short Course in Career Education in Year 10 helps students select the ideal combination of subjects and courses to optimise the student's chances of achieving their desired ATAR score.

PREPARATION FOR VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Students wishing to study at TAFE or gain an apprenticeship/traineeship can undertake

TAFE preparation courses and/or choose Applied Subjects. Past graduates have received qualifications in courses such as Childcare, Media & TV, Electro Engineering, Aviation, Hospitality and Plumbing.

PASTORAL CARE

The Senior School students have Pastoral Care teachers, Year level coordinators, Campus Leadership, the College Chaplain, the College Counsellor and the Careers Counsellor to guide them in their day-to-day College life. The Senior School (Y10–12) pastoral care classes are formed vertically in house groups, allowing for the development of group relationships and mentoring between students of different year levels allowing for siblings to spend time together in pastoral class time if/when they are in Years 10–12 at the same time. This structure helps build house spirit, encourage leadership and fosters peer-to-peer guidance and coaching.

LEADERSHIP IN SENIOR SCHOOL

Our approach to student leadership aims to help our students recognise and develop their leadership skills through a range of service-based opportunities which support the College and the broader community. Students can aspire to leadership roles as well as Buddy roles to support younger students.

EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT

Should a student need additional support, they will be assessed and given assistance with assignment or test support, career planning or Allied Health diagnostics and services.

UNIMATCHED Outdoor Education Program

A stand out time for students during their Prince of Peace schooling journey is their participation in Outdoor Education. In fact, Outdoor Education is a hallmark program for all Lutheran Education schools and we proudly deliver one of the best on offer.

Outdoor Education offers a multifaceted approach to learning and personal development. These outdoor experiences often leave a lasting impact on students, shaping their perspectives and attitudes toward the natural world, God's creation and their own capabilities.

Students at Prince of Peace commence Outdoor Education opportunities in Year 2 and continue right through until Year 11. It is a key part of our curriculum, central to holistic student development and it is unmatched in terms of student focus and program depth.

We believe that the outdoor education opportunities provided to our students, from their very first 'sleep over' experience in Year 2 right through to the Year 11 Leadership Camp, support the development of confidence, self-sufficiency, initiative, teamwork and leadership skills.

Five major benefits of outdoor education are:

Holistic Learning – going beyond the traditional classroom setting, allowing individuals to connect with the natural environment and God's creation

Physical Health & Wellbeing
– whether hiking, camping or team building, physical activity is encouraged

Social & Emotional Development – helps build communication skills, teamwork, leadership and resilience

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Environmental Awareness and Stewardship – fosters environmental responsibility and preservation

Enhanced creativity and critical thinking – stimulates adaptability, resourcefulness and encourages out of the box thinking

THE YEAR 9 – THREE WEEK MT BINGA EXPERIENCE


Year 9 students participate in a three-week outdoor education experience at Mt Binga, near Blackbutt. The camp is a significant milestone in the social, emotional and spiritual development of our Middle School students and includes community living, horse riding, farm work, abseiling, hiking, overnight outdoor camping and team challenges.

Based near Blackbutt, students spend three weeks living in their class group as a community. The simple tasks of everyday living, such as cooking, cleaning, washing and tending the animals provide challenges and learning lessons of their own. Phones and other technology are left at home and students create their own entertainment. The evening fire, essential for the warming of water for an evening shower, also provides a central point around which students gather to chat, play music and just enjoy each other's company.

Parents and students are encouraged to write letters to one another and these, in our world of instant but ephemeral communication, are treasured by both. Parents and siblings join the students for the last day of their time at Mt Binga and students are then able to give their families an insight into their experience and enjoy a meal together prior to going home.

Students consistently rate our Year 9, three-week Outdoor Education experience at Mt Binga as transformative and one of the highlights of their schooling life. Parents agree.

Stronger together: Never UNDERESTIMATE the power of participation

Sporting participation is encouraged at Prince of Peace and with that comes balance in a student's life, health benefits and improved academic outcomes.

Our goal is to provide a sporting program that complements Club Sport (so that students can play their sport of choice on weekends) through focusing on skills development and tactical awareness, whilst still giving students the opportunity to play and bond as a team by representing Prince of Peace in selected competitions.

As a founding member of the Northern Independent Schools Sporting Association (NISSA), our students compete against other private schools on the north side of Brisbane from Years 4-10. Students in Years 4-6 train and then participate in six Gala Days throughout the year. Students in Years 7 and 8 participate in NISSA sport each Wednesday afternoon during school hours, and Years 9 and 10 compete each Thursday afternoon during school hours. Sporting opportunities include tee ball, AFL, netball, soccer, volleyball, basketball and touch football.

Years 11 – 12 students participate in NISSA Gala Days against other NISSA schools as their subject load permits. In addition to this, our Year 11-12 students also participate in a Sports and Recreation Program alongside their studies, providing them with a range of opportunities including futsal, indoor cricket, volleyball, softball, tennis and soccer.

Interhouse competitions take place throughout the year for cross country, swimming and athletics. Students can qualify to represent the College at NISSA Athletics and Swimming Representative Events, and local District, Regional, State and National competitions.

SPORTS COACHING AND TRAINING Training and preparation for school-based competitions, NISSA, district and regional events are organised by the HPE staff when appropriate. This includes running preparation for distance and cross-country events and other athletic, track and field coaching.

- Drumming Circle


In addition to the College ensembles and choirs, students have the opportunity to become part of the Middle or Senior School worship bands that provide musical support to the weekly worship services on each campus.

COLLEGE CHAPLAIN

The Chaplain's role is primarily to minister to students, staff and families of the College. This is achieved through both pastoral care and fostering the emotional and spiritual growth of students – both in individual and small group initiatives, supporting the Christian Studies program, leading Chapel and worship services, partnering with the College Counsellor, and close support of teaching and other staff in their work with students.

COLLEGE COUNSELLOR

Our College Counsellor can assist referred students in a range of areas including helping young people with behavioural issues, to developing healthy self-esteem, communication skills and resilience, and providing support around building a happy family environment.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST AND SPEECH PATHOLOGIST

Parents can also access an Occupational Therapist and Speech Pathologist through the College on a fee-for-service basis. Services are provided on-site during the school day. We also have Therapy House here to provide psychologists/family therapy if required.

OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE

Prince of Peace Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) offers before school, after school, pupil-free day and vacation care for children from Prep through to Year 6, 50 weeks of the year. Based on the Junior Campus, the hours of operation are below, with closures on weekends and public holidays:

- Pupil-free day care: 6:30am 6:00pm
- Vacation care: 6:30am 6:00pm


